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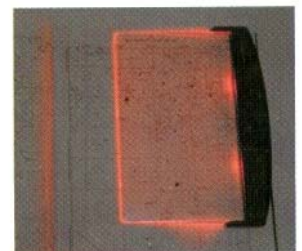
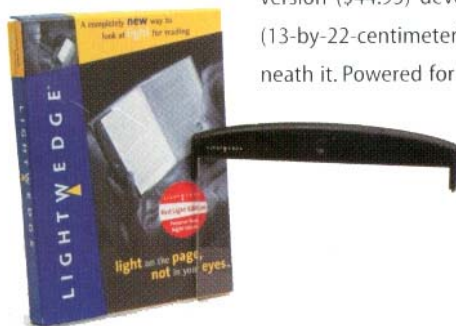

### *Lighting the Way*

Developed for night-owl bookworms, **LightWedge** (\$34.95 for the white-light version) is the perfect way to illuminate the page of a book without excessive light spill that might annoy others around you. Now there's a red-light version (\$44.95) developed specifically for pilots and astronomers. The 5¼-by-8¾-inch (13-by-22-centimeter) plastic panel spreads even red illumination on any page placed beneath it. Powered for up to 40 hours by a set of four AAA batteries, the red light-emitting

diodes offer two levels of brightness selected with a push-button switch that's easy to operate with gloved hands. The 8½-ounce

LightWedge is hefty enough to hold the page of a book open or keep a star chart from blowing away in a breeze.
